A wine tasting excursion while vacationing in Santa Ynez first inspired Chuck and Kim to collaborate. In 1985, after Chuck completed his degree in Enology and Kim received her Master's in Business Administration, Chuck began his apprenticeship as assistant winemaker for Estrella River Winery and Meridian Vineyards. One of few technically trained winemakers in the area, he soon began consulting for smaller wineries in Paso Robles. By 1989, Chuck's consulting had turned into a full time endeavor, affording him the opportunity to establish Harmony Cellars.

Founded on the principle that wine needn't cost a king's ransom, Chuck strives to produce the best possible wine at the best possible value. Harmony wines reflect Chuck's winemaking philosophy: "Make wine for food and let the grape express its character." Each varietal is distinctly different and crafted in a method that complements the lush, ripe fruit.

Winemaking in Harmony is not new; the tradition goes back to the late 1800s. Kim's great-grandfather, Giacomo Barlogio, a founder of the old creamery cooperative in downtown Harmony, used to make wine in his basement. Today, Harmony Cellars sits on part of Giacomo's original land holdings—land that has been in Kim's family for four generations.
